NATIONAL LAW SCHOOL OF INDIA UNIVERSITY

The National Law School of India University, Bangalore, established under the National Law School of India Act (Karnataka Act 22 of 1986) in 1987 with the Chief Justice of India as its Chancellor, is the first and the only law university fully supported by the Bar Council of India and the Bench. One of the main objectives of NLSIU is to 'bring legal education on par with other professional courses like medicine and engineering, where a student fresh out of high-school can make an immediate career choice'. It has made strides in teaching law courses with both interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary dimensions and facilitating research and publication on these lines since its establishment. An abstract of the research paper, not exceeding **350** words, accompanied with a covering letter containing: Title of the Paper, Full Name of the **Author/Authors (Limited to 2 Authors)**, complete address with contact number and E-mail Address must be submitted as an attachment and mailed to **bcwlcintconf2018@gmail.com**. Abstracts must be accompanied with key words (**Limited to 5**). The last date for the submission of the abstract is **5th April 2018**. Notification of the accepted abstracts will be done on/ before **7th April 2018**. Selected abstracts of papers will be published in the **Conference Proceedings**. The text of the abstract must be in **MS WORD FORMAT WITH TIMES NEW ROMAN, FONT SIZE 12 and WITH 1.5 LINE SPACING**.

FINAL PAPER SUBMISSION: GUIDELINES

Following the selection of the abstract, a final paper must be sent on or before **2nd May 2018** and must be presented in person in the conference. The paper must be accompanied with a covering letter containing: Title of the Paper, Full Name of the Author/Authors, Complete Address with Contact Number and E-mail Address which must be submitted as an attachment

and mailed to bcwlcintconf2018@gmail.com. The submissions received shall be reviewed by respective law experts on the selection committee. The decision of the selection committee shall be final. Papers must be original work of the Author/ Authors. The text must be in - **MS WORD FORMAT WITH TIMES NEW ROMAN, FONT SIZE 12 WITH 1.5 LINE SPACING**. The footnotes [no end notes] must be - **TIMES NEW ROMAN WITH FONT SIZE 10 WITH LINE SPACING OF 1.0**. Length of the paper should be between 3000- 5000 words. The final paper must be accompanied with the abstract and key words. All references should be properly cited and bibliography should be provided.
